Reading Comprehension

Reading Passage:

All work groups possess some degree of cohesiveness and productivity, both of which can vary along a continuum. Some experts feel that there is a linear relationship between the two – the more cohesive a group, the more productive it is. Others argue that the relationship is not linear. That is, an increase in cohesiveness results in an increase in productivity up to a certain point, but when cohesiveness increases beyond that point, productivity suffers. For example, a group with very high cohesiveness may become too social in nature, resulting in decreased work focus. Additionally, group members' unwillingness to question others' ideas because they fear offending others could cause problems. Before individuals in a group attempt to change productivity, members need to ensure that the determinants of cohesiveness are present and in balance.
